## LOS COLORES



Rojo Santa Clause dresses in red and says ho, ho, ho...rojo/a(s) - red.



Azul Lazu the sad, blue dog sneezes Azuu! If you repeat his name Lazu, Lazu... or his sneeze Azuu! you end up saying azul(es) - blue.



Amarillo Take out the **r** from armadillo, say the word **amadillo**, and it will almost sound the same as **amarillo**/ $\mathbf{a}(\underline{s})$  - **yellow**.



**Verde** Green bears have their own calendar day on **Bear Day**, which almost sounds like  $\mathbf{verde}(\underline{s})$  -  $\mathbf{green}$ .



**Negro** A plant in a black, dark room will have **no-grow**. Instead of saying nogrow, say **ne-grow** which almost sounds like  $negro/a(\underline{s})$  - black.



Blanco What color comes to your mind when you think of a **blank** space? **blanco/** $a(\underline{s})$  - white.



Morado - There is more shadow on a purple wall than on a black wall. Take out the sh from more shadow. More-adow sounds like morado/a(s) - purple.



Café What do some grown-ups like to drink in the morning? Coffee at the cafeteria sounds like café. The word café is used for the drink and the color café(s) - brown.



Rosa The pink rose sounds like the color  $rosa(\underline{s})$  or  $rosado/a(\underline{s})$  - pink.



Gris The grease leaking from a car is gray. The word **grease** sounds like **gris**(<u>es</u>) - gray.



Anaranjado Separate the word into four parts... Ana-ran-hard-oh! Take the r in hard out and it sounds like anaranjado/a(s) - orange. The fruit "orange" is called naranja.
